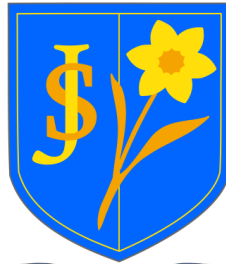


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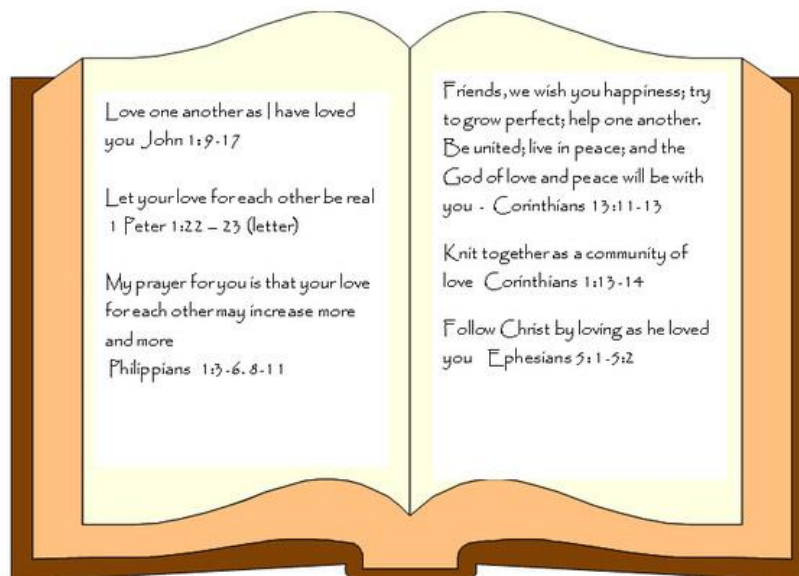

Policy status

Recommended with review every three years.

Purpose

It is our policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for school uniform in our school prospectus.

Uniform

Normal

- Navy skirt or pinafore or grey trousers
- white shirt
- school tie
- navy cardigan or jumper
- grey, white or navy socks or grey tights
- black shoes or plain, flat, black ankle boots

Summer Term and 1st two weeks of September (Optional)

- Sky blue polo shirt with grey shorts or navy skirt *or*
- Light blue & white gingham dress/culottes

Our school uniform suppliers are Boppers Boutique (Tel: 532241). We do not insist that jumpers/polo shirts are embroidered with the school badge.

A supply of good quality pre-loved uniform is available from school, and is managed by the PTA.

School uniform grants are available from Conwy for those families entitled to apply each year.

Hair

Long hair must be tied back. Only natural hair colours are permitted in school.

Suggested PE/Sports Kit

- Black pumps/trainers
- white polo shirt/T-shirt
- navy shorts/skirt,

Children are permitted to wear plain, dark coloured tracksuit bottoms for PE during the second half of Autumn term and the first half of Spring term.

Jewellery

No jewellery should be worn for school, except for basic stud earrings. Wrist watches are allowed, but the school cannot be held responsible for loss, or damage.

Roles and responsibilities of Headteacher and staff

- Consult with parents in the event of any change of supplier
- Accept no liability for loss or damage to uniform or personal items worn or brought to school
- In the event of an infringement of our school uniform policy
 - In the first instance a staff member will have a discrete discussion with the pupil regarding the infringement and any remedial action that may be required (eg; changing into PE pumps if shoes are unsuitable, hoodie to removed and hung on peg)
 - In the case of persistent and flagrant infringements, parents will be contacted

Roles and responsibilities of Parents

- To support and accept our school uniform policy
- Send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their school work; ensuring that their uniform is clean and in good repair
- Clearly label their child's clothing/shoes with their name and class

Roles and responsibilities of the Governing Body

- Support the Headteacher in implementing this school uniform policy
- Consider representations from parents regarding this policy
- Liaise with Headteacher to ensure that this policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity
- Ensure that our school uniform meets and is consistent with all national regulations concerning equal opportunities

Equal Opportunities

The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. The school will consider sympathetically, any serious reasons (eg; religious objections) why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform. Similarly, should an item of school uniform prove problematic for a pupil with disabilities, parents are invited to draw this to the attention of the Headteacher.
