

Policy Statement

Spiritual Development at St Joseph's

- Within the Areas of Learning and Programmes of Study opportunities are provided for pupils to reflect on the values, experiences and attitudes of others.
- Within the Areas of Learning and Programmes of Study opportunities are provided for pupils to understand and reflect on the physical world of God's creation
- Pupils are encouraged to widen their horizons in all areas of the curriculum.
- Opportunities are planned across the curriculum for pupils to explore their own feelings, and express them in their work.
- Pupils are encouraged to take responsibility for their own learning.
- Pupils are shown how to recognise God's presence in their work and in their lives.
- The liturgy and worship planned for the pupils actively promotes spiritual development.
- The school identifies and provides for those with additional learning needs and this includes their spiritual development.
- Class rules, ticks, stickers, certificates and badges are used to encourage the pupils to give of their best.
- Within the assessment process targets are set for each pupil and this encourages pupils to reflect on their work.
- In all areas of the curriculum the pupils are encouraged to be aware of/ to reflect on/ to respond to God's presence in the life of all those in our school.

Moral Development at St Joseph's

- Within the Areas of Learning and Programmes of Study opportunities will be provided for pupils to form a moral conscience.
- Within the Areas of Learning and Programmes of Study pupils will be given help to understand the complexities of moral choices.
- Throughout the curriculum pupils will study the moral choices of others and their impact on society.
- Pupils are encouraged to make independent, rational and informed judgements across the curriculum.
- Opportunities are provided across the curriculum for pupils to cooperate with each other in their work.
- The pupil's ability to cooperate is assessed throughout the school and across the curriculum.
- Through determining, adhering and referring to our Mission Statement pupils are encouraged to cooperate with each other throughout the school.
- The school identifies and provides for those with additional learning needs and this includes their moral development.

- The RE scheme and Collective worship help motivate pupils to behave in a moral way.
- Class rules, ticks, stickers, certificates, badges and Assertive Mentoring strategies, alongside the positive behaviour management systems of the school help to promote moral development and behaviour.
- The themes of liturgy and worship encourage moral development.
- The school's policies are based on Gospel values.
- The moral development is promoted and developed across the full range, ability and age of pupils within the school, in all areas of the curriculum and especially in the development and behaviour of the pupils.
